A Note from Pastor Jess

People live out their faith in different ways. One person's walk with Jesus may look completely different from another person's journey with the same Jesus. How can that happen if we are all following Jesus? Shouldn't our journeys look the same once we commit to following Jesus? Not at all!

If you came to Vacation Bible School, you may remember that we discussed that everyone is called by God but not everyone is called to the same task. This means that our discipleship, the way we live out our faith, is not going to look identical to anyone else's discipleship. But there may be similarities.

For the Gospel Discipleship Series, everyone will be answering questions to figure out which model of discipleship describes them best and we are using the gospels to identify/define the models. Within our holy scripture, we have four Gospels that each tell the story of Jesus a little differently. While they agree on many things, they also diverge from each other on a few things. Each gospel has its own emphasis and way of communicating the life and teachings of Jesus. One gospel likes to leave things to mystery and focus very little on the teachings of Jesus. One gospel includes parables not found in the other three. One gospel connects Jesus to Old Testament scripture frequently. One gospel offers more commentary or explanation of events.

We will spend some time exploring the emphases of each gospel and how those emphases correspond to different types of disciples. You may be surprised to find which discipleship path speaks the most to you or maybe you will confirm what you already knew about your walk with Jesus. Hopefully this sermon series will help you not only grow in your walk but also help you better understand those who are following the same Savior in a different way.

In order to do this in an authentic way, your pastors and two others from our clergy circuit will be speaking on the gospel discipleship with which they align (it may be their primary or secondary type as some closely aligned with two). During the series those who gather for worship will hear from Kasey Vogel from the Lamoni-Davis City UMCs speak on Markan Discipleship, me speak on Matthean Discipleship, Tim on Lukan Discipleship, and Linda Hoover from the Redding-Middle Fork- Mt Ayr UMCs on Johannine Discipleship.

Please be in prayer for the churches involved and for the four pastors who will find themselves in ten different churches during the series!

Tim's Thoughts

As I look back over the past month, and look ahead to the month to come, I find myself thinking about the theme for our parish Vacation Bible School, "God Calls You." It is a little hard to believe, but VBS did take place less than a month ago. It was loads of fun for everyone, and I enjoyed bringing the Bible stories to life for the kids and adults. The first night we did the story of Sarah and Abraham being called to be the parents of a great nation, and we discussed how you can never be too old or too young for God to call you. The second night was Moses being called by God from the burning bush. Moses gave excuse after excuse as to why it shouldn't be him, but God called him anyhow and promised to have his brother help speak for him when he



stammered. This showed us that when God calls us to do something, God will provide help if we need it and ensure that we can overcome every obstacle to do what God is calling us to do. On the final night, we heard Jesus call the fisherman Simon Peter and then Levi the tax collector. We discussed how no one wanted to spend time with fishermen in those days, because they smelled so bad, and how all people really hated tax collectors as well. But this goes to show us that God can and will call anyone. No matter what we do, God can still call us; and no matter what anyone else does, we should not judge because God may be calling them as well. While I was a little sad I didn't get to play any of the games or do any crafts, it was great to see everyone considering all of the ways God can call us.

As we head into September and back to school, I am thinking about all of the possible paths ahead of us this school year, and wondering what God is calling each of us to. The young kids still trying to find their own identities, the young adults planning to graduate soon and considering what future careers they may be called to, and all of the adults helping the kids along while still trying to navigate all the complexities of their own paths. 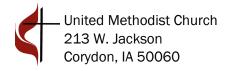
